OMM WAIST POUCH 148g **>theomm.com**

Not great if for carrying kit as you're limited to one tiny waist pouch with key clip. The 600ml horizontal bottle is stable but the toggle fastening is fiddly and you have to bring the pack round to the front. The TPU-covered top pouch does enable smart phone use, which is handy if you use it for navigation or logging runs.

Super simple with a single waterproof ripstop 3.5-litre main compartment and a highly effective compression bungee keeping it stable and ideal for quickly stashing a jacket. Elasticated waist pockets are good for gels and it has a key clip inside. Pack with essentials, leave in the car and you're always ready to go.

VERDICT

Clever smart phone pouch and good to run in, but lacks space.

Brilliant for short runs or races where you don't need water.







LIFEVENTURE BASE RUNNER 2 524g (incl bottles) >lifeventure.co.uk

Topping 500g before filling the two 600ml bottles, this isn't light but its 4-litre capacity gobbles kit. There's a main compartment, and a separate pouch with key fob. It's stable with very effective compression straps. The Air-Flow back keeps clamminess at bay. You have to slow to a walk to get the bottles in and out though.

VERDICT

Versatile workhorse great for ultras and big training days.



SALOMON AGILE BELT 174g (incl 500ml bottle) salomon.com

The Velcro waistband is great - no buckle to dig in and it's easy to fit. There's plenty of kit room plus a key clip in the main compartment. Either of the two big mesh pockets hold the brilliant soft bottle, simple to get out and replace on the move, and the other swallows more gear. Two smaller mesh pockets hold gels and bars.

VERDICT

Superb lightweight comfort, innovative features and value.

Light but compact, 100% carbon, robust and sturdy poles with carbide tips, light for uphills, stable on downhills. Very breathable foam grip with moisturewicking strap. Easy and quick 3-section 'Z-Pole' folding design,

MOUNTAIN KING TRAIL BLAZE £75

The only aluminium poles in the test and noticeably the lightest but still very strong with carbide tip. Hand grip and simple wrist loop work well. Collapses into 4 sections for easy packing. Great value and replacement parts available. Sizes 110cm, 115cm, 120cm, 125cm, 130cm Best for ultra light racing and long distance training on a budget.



RAIDLIGHT CARBON TRAIL

Light yet strong-feeling ultralight carbon pole with kevlar-tip. Quick-release hand strap works swiftly, an important feature for changing clothes and eating on the move. Compact once folded, but not many sizes available.
